### Mrs. Margaret Court (Australia)

The current Wimbledon Champion—also won in 1963 and 1965. Holds or has held, often for a record number of times, the Singles, Doubles and Mixed Championships of Australia, Italy, France the United States, Germany and South Africa. First Wimbledon appearance was in 1961 when she lost in the quarter finals to Christine Truman.

Born Margaret Smith in New South Wales on the 16th July, 1942.



### Miss Virginia Wade (G.B.)

Made her Whiteman Cup debut in 1965 and has played regularly since. Has reached the later rounds of many tournaments around the world, climaxed by winning the United States Open Championship in 1968, beating Rosemary Casals, Judy Tegart, Ann Jones and Billie Jean-King on the way.

A Kent County player, she was born at Bournemouth on the 10th July, 1945.

**Miss Francoise Durr (France)**

This outstanding French tennis player won her first French closed title in 1962, and has since often reached the quarter-final and semi-final rounds of many tournaments around the world. She was the French and German champion in 1967 and has since (with Ann Jones) won a number of doubles events—the French in 1968, and the South African, Italian and French again in 1969.

'Frankie' Durr was born at Beziers on Christmas Day 1942.



**Miss Evonne Goolagong (Australia)**

Ranked by many authorities as the best prospect since Margaret Court. This all-round athlete has represented her school at athletics, swimming and basket ball as well as tennis. Won her first important tournament in 1964, the New South Wales Under-13 Hard Court event.

At not quite twenty years of age (born 31st July, 1951), she remains one of the most exciting young tennis prospects.
