A Brief History of the Notts Open Tennis Tournament

In common with so many other 'annual' events, the Notts. Open Tennis Tournament was not held during the two World Wars. Apart from those sad times, however, the Tournament has been held every year since its inception in 1887, when each of the Singles events was appropriately won by a member of the redoubtable Snook family.

That first Tournament, and succeeding ones until 1899, were held at Trent Bridge or the neighbouring grounds of Notts. Castle C.C. In 1899 the Tournament moved to the Park and there it has remained to the present day, using not only the Association's own courts but those of the Park and Newcastle Tennis Clubs, probably the oldest clubs in Nottingham.

Connoisseurs of the game will be interested to compare the international flavour of the winners since 1946 with the famous names of pre-war years who achieved the Notts. Open title; the brothers F. W. and H. D. Snook; C. P. Dixon, considered by many to be the finest English Doubles player of all time, twice a Singles finalist at Wimbledon, twice Doubles winner there and a member of the team which beat Australia to regain the Davis Cup for Great Britain too many years ago – Notts. men all, these; E. R. Allen, 'half' of the famous Allen twins, a Singles winner here on five occasions; A. W. Gore, H. L. Doherty, L. A. Godfree – and, in 1932, the current President of Notts. L.T.A., Eric Attewell.

Among the ladies too, names from the past evoke recognition and memories – Mrs. Lambert Chambers, Miss F. E. M. Snook, who won the first Ladies' Singles in 1887 and was still in there winning a decade later, in 1895 and 1896; the ageless Miss Middleton, who won the last pre-war event in 1939 and followed this by winning the first post-war one in 1946. And of course Miss Freda James, later Mrs. Hammersley, surely the finest Notts. woman player ever, twice Wimbledon Doubles winner (with Kay

Stammers) and a regular member of the British Wightman Cup team of those days.

In 1964 The Lawn Tennis Association authorised the sponsoring of tennis tournaments. In that year, Notts. were fortunate to gain the support of the Mansfield Brewery Co., a support which has been steadily maintained every year since and which has earned the gratitude not only of the Association but of the public too, for thus they have been given the opportunity to see players of very high standard – in that first year, Miss Darlene Hard beat Miss Maria Bueno in the Ladies' Singles final.

Then in 1966 John Player and Sons added their support and they too have continued it annually since, not only financially but in other ways of first importance – such as the design and production of this programme. With 1968 and the advent in this Country of truly 'open' tennis, a reorganisation of the help given by Player's has resulted in a greater monetary content to enable this Tournament to maintain and indeed expand the standard of tennis and of competitors, standards which the growing number of spectators has come to expect.

There are many others to whom thanks are due – the Lord Mayor and Sheriff of Nottingham and their Ladies, unfailing Patrons on Finals day; the willing voluntary helpers; the citizens of Nottingham who feed and accommodate the players in their homes; not least, of course, the competitors themselves, from many parts of the world, old friends and new, whom it is a pleasure to meet and watch for a brief week in each year.

It is the aim of the organisers to continue to provide entertainment and thrills of the kind which have brought you here today and will, it is hoped, bring you – and your friends – again and again.
